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Note: This day-by-day itinerary is for guidance only. Due to the variable weather conditions of the southern oceans and wildlife viewing opportunities, excursion details and ports of call may change during this expedition-style program.

Day 1 | January 11

Depart your home city.

Day 2 | January 12 R

Buenos Aires, Argentina

Arrive in Buenos Aires. Check in to your hotel and enjoy leisure time in this capital city.

Meet new friends at tonight's Welcome Reception.

Day 3 | January 13 B

Buenos Aires

Buenos Aires is host to diverse and dynamic barrios. On a walking tour, see the colorful La Boca district, Monserrat's public buildings, historical Plaza de Mayo, Palermo's lavish parks, Puerto Madero's riverfront community and the authentic old quarter of San Telmo.

Continue to the historical Recoleta Cemetery, famous for its elaborate vaults and sculptures. It is also the final resting place of Eva Perón — Argentina's legendary former First Lady.

Day 4 | January 14 B-L-D

Buenos Aires | Ushuaia | Embark | Beagle Channel

Fly to Ushuaia, nicknamed the "End of the World" due to its location on the tip of South America. Upon arrival, enjoy an excursion to the remote Tierra del Fuego National Park, home to a subantarctic forest and diverse animal species.

Embark the Exploris One and begin cruising the Beagle Channel, named for the research vessel that carried Charles Darwin when he explored the area from 1861 to 1865. As you depart, watch the rugged coastline fade into the horizon behind you.

Day 5 | January 15 B-L-R-D

Cruising the Drake Passage Cross the Drake Passage, the deep waterway that connects the Atlantic and Pacific oceans between Cape Horn and the South Shetland Islands.

Attend tonight's Captain's Welcome Reception.

Day 6 | January 16 B-L-D

Cruising the Drake Passage
Your expedition team will
prepare you for your first
landing in Antarctica. Linger
in the twilight of the Antarctic
summer and watch for
albatrosses, looming icebergs
and humpback whales feeding
from the nutrient-rich waters.





Day 7 | January 17

B-L-L

Port Lockroy, Antarctica | Jougla Point

Take your first steps on snow-covered lands at Port Lockroy, built as a British intelligence port during World War II and then converted into a whaling station and scientific base.

Observe the daily activities of past researchers at the living museum known as "Base A" and mail a postcard with an Antarctica postmark from the official British Post Office.

Cruise by rocky Jougla Point on Wiencke Island. See artifacts of the whaling industry, such as the skeletal remains of a blue whale. The area is home to gentoo penguin colonies, skuas and Antarctic hags.

Day 8 | January 18

B-L-D

Petermann Island | Lemaire Channel

Call at Petermann Island, where French explorer Jean-Baptiste Charcot wintered in 1909. Watch for the famous rookeries of Adélie and gentoo penguins and blue-eyed shags.

Cruise through the seven-mile-long Lemaire Channel, a sensational passage flanked by towering glacial cliffs. These miles of mountains and interweaving patterns of floes brim with wildlife.

Day 9 | January 19 B-L-D

Neko Harbor | Paradise Harbor

Listen for the low rumbling of Rudolf Glacier as it calves

slabs of ice into Neko Harbor, named after the whaling ship that was stationed here from 1911-1924. Surrounded by soaring glaciers and snow-covered mountains, this spectacular harbor is one of the most dramatic sights on your expedition.

Paradise Harbor was named by 19th-century whalers who sought shelter in its coves. It is an ideal sanctuary for marine wildlife, including humpback whales and crabeater seals.

Day 10 | January 20 B-L-D

Deception Island | Half Moon Island

Walk in the footsteps of great explorers on Deception Island, an extinct volcano in the South Shetland chain. Named







by Captain Nathaniel Palmer, this horseshoe-shaped island boasts a rich human history. Though it is now uninhabited, there are remnants of army bases and whaling and research stations. Enter through Neptune's Bellow and enjoy a Zodiac ride to a black sand beach on Port Foster.

One of the smallest but most alluring of the South Shetland Islands is the crescent-shaped Half Moon Island, known for its craggy volcanic rock, a colony of chinstrap penguins and Cámara Station, a base monitored by Argentine biologists.

Day 11 | January 21

Cruising the Drake Passage Re-enter the Drake Passage and behold outdoor sights during a day at sea. Enjoy informative discussions about your Antarctic experience with the ship's naturalists.

Day 12 | January 22 B-L-R-D

Cape Horn | Beagle Channel Round the mythical Cape Horn, a celebrated maritime landmark and the graveyard of ships that once battled the westerly winds. Turn north and set a course for Ushuaia.

Attend the Captain's Farewell Reception tonight and raise a toast to your momentous adventure.

Day 13 | January 23

Ushuaia, Argentina | Disembark | Buenos Aires This morning, we arrive in Ushuaia. Disembark and fly to Buenos Aires to begin your
